



Brite Divinity School announces a lecture led by **Dr. Francisco Garcia-Treto**, Distinguished Professor of Religion Emeritus at Trinity University and a member of the Board of Trustees at Princeton Theological Seminary.

Dr. Garcia - Treto came to the United States in 1950. He studied at Princeton Theological Seminary. Garcia -Treto returned to the United States when his university studies in Cuba were interrupted by the government in 1955.

He attended Maryville College in Tennessee. He was planning to stay there for a year to learn English, and become a chemical engineer. When he decided to join the seminary, he changed his major to philosophy and took classical Greek, so that when he came to Princeton Seminary as a Master of Divinity student in 1959, he started Hebrew right away. Dr. Garcia -Treto says that he fell in love with the language, and he decided he wanted to teach Old Testament.

Dr. Garcia -Treto earned his Masters of Divinity in 1962 and right after that, Garcia -Treto pursued his doctorate degree at Princeton Theological Seminary and graduated in 1966.

Born in Cardenas, Cuba, and naturalized U.S. citizen, in 1967.
