Over the past 8 years, John and his colleague Ike Lasater have developed international NVC mediation trainings and yearlong immersion programs in the U.S., Europe, Australia and South Korea, including work with Afghan tribal elders along the Pakistani border in early 2002, where they saw firsthand that - despite at least eight languages being used and layers of cobbled-together, ad hoc translation - connection to

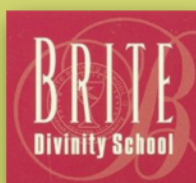
